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Diversified Opportunities, Inc. Programs and Services

Day Supports Program serves individuals who have intellectual/developmental disabilities. Assists with the acquisition, retention, and improvement of independence in areas such as self-help, socialization, adaptive, and pre-vocational skills.

Adult Developmental Vocational Program (ADVP) provides vocational skills, personal enrichment activities, life skills and community integration to enable trainees to work and live as independently as possible.

Adult Basic Education with Wilson Community College Staff provides trainees with intellectual and developmental disabilities instruction in basic reading and writing skills. Personal and community living skills are also taught in the classroom sessions.

Vocational Evaluation identifies an individual's job strengths, needs, and interests through situational assessments, interviews and behavioral observations both in the facility and/or in the community. These findings are then used to identify career goals, vocational directions and address any limitation the individual may have toward employment.

Work Adjustment prepares a trainee for entry into the competitive labor market by removing barriers to employment. Individual needs are addressed and may include self-determination, decision making, resume completion, dress and appearance, interview skills and work habits. Trainees may be involved in a variety of activities to help prepare them for work including training classes and community activities. On-the-job training to learn specific job duties and encourage appropriate social skills in the workplace continues once a trainee obtains employment.

Supported Employment & Long-Term Vocational Support is a community based vocational service for trainees with more severe disabilities who want to work independently within their community. Supplemental Evaluations, Situational Assessments, Intensive On-the-Job Training and Long Term Vocational Support (LTVS) services are available. Contact with both the employee and the employer is maintained to assist with job maintenance and ensure an ongoing successful working relationship.
